

# Year 11 (Stage 1 SACE) Selection Guide 2024

This selection form is a guide for students and parents to discuss their subject selections in the lead up to formal course counselling in term 3. At that time subject choices will be entered during interviews with students and parents in week 6 of term 3. Students will select a total of 110 SACE credits from the following subject groups (a full year subject counts as 20 credits).

## **1. Activating Identities and Futures: 10 SACE Credits**

### 2. Literacy Requirement: 20 SACE Credits

Students undertake <u>one</u> of the following options. Students must achieve a C grade or better in their chosen option:

- □ English (Full Year)

- □ Essential English (Full Year)

### 3. Numeracy Requirement: 10–20 SACE Credits

Students undertake <u>one</u> from the following options. Students must achieve a C grade or better in at least one semester from their chosen option:

- □ Mathematical Methods (Full Year)
- General Mathematics (Full Year)
- General Mathematics (Semester)
- Essential Mathematics (Full Year)
- **Essential Mathematics** (Semester)

Students intending on undertaking General Mathematics at Stage 2 SACE level in year 12 must choose General Mathematics for a full year in Year 11. Essential Mathematics does not offer a pathway into Stage 2 Mathematics.

# 4. Choice Subjects: 60-70 SACE Credits

Students choose 60–70 Credits (depending on their numeracy choice) from the subjects list on the following page.

Students <u>may</u> wish to undertake 1 subject offered through the International Baccalaureate Programme. This subject will provide 20 SACE Stage 1 credits. For information on subjects, please visit the <u>IBDP Overview</u> of the Unley High School Curriculum Handbook.
