The following outlines specific information to elaborate upon the subject options outlined on the first page. For even more information, please visit the <u>Unley High School website</u>.

Personal and Social Identity [PSI]

Students continue with the same PSI group from year 9 in 2024.

Special Interest Programs

Special Interest Rowing

Only students in this program can undertake HPE [Rowing A] and do so as their minimum Health and Physical Education requirement (indicated in step 3 on the first page). Students in this program may elect to continue HPE [Rowing] for a full year by selecting HPE [Rowing B] in step 4.

Summit STEM

Students in this program undertake Science and Mathematics within the Summit STEM Program for a full year in Year 10. Students must select STEM and Mathematics Plus in step 4.

Summit English/Language

Students in this program undertake English, Language and HASS within the Summit English/Language Program. Students continue Summit English for a full year and Summit History for a semester in Year 10. Students must select their current Language subject in step 4.

French Bilingual Program

Students enrolled in this program study French and Histoire/Geographie in French in Year 10 for a full year.

Other Subjects*

Café & Barista Skills

Students electing to undertake <u>Café & Barista Skills</u> need to complete a separate application. Students undertaking this course should be considering a pathway within the Hospitality industry and will complete competencies towards Cert II Hospitality.

Exploring Identities & Futures [EIF] / Personal Learning Plan [PLP]

Students electing to undertake <u>EIF – Peer Support</u> or <u>EIF – Gateway2Trades</u> need to complete a separate application. In addition, students selecting Gateway to Trades must also select the Gateway to Trades choice in step 4. Both subjects will be undertaken in conjunction in the same semester.

<u> Mathematics Plus</u>

Students intending to study Mathematical Methods (with or without Specialist Maths) at Stage 1 SACE level in year 11 must select Maths Plus in Year 10. They will undertake this subject in semester 2 in addition to their compulsory Mathematics class, therefore studying 2 lines of Mathematics.

Music

Only students enrolled in Music as a subject can access instrumental lessons at Unley High School. For further details about the Music program and instrumental options, please read the <u>Music Information</u> and consider the recommended background outlined in the curriculum handbook.

STEM

Students electing to undertake <u>STEM</u> need to have completed Year 9 Science and Mathematics with a B-grade or higher, and intend to study Chemistry, Physics and/or Mathematical Methods at Stage 1 SACE level in Year 11.
