

Year 11 Subject Selection Guide 2026

This selection form is a guide for students and parents to discuss their subject selections in the lead up to formal course counselling in term 3. At that time subject choices will be entered during interviews with students and parents in week 5 of Term 3. Students are encouraged to print and complete a copy of the form on page 3 of this guide and bring this to their interview. Students will select a total of 110 <u>SACE</u> credits from the following subject groups.

1. Activating Identities and Futures [AIF]: 10 SACE Credits

All students undertake AIF and must achieve a C- grade or better:

Activating Identities & Futures [AIF] (Semester)

2. Literacy Requirement: 20 SACE Credits

All students undertake <u>one</u> of the following options and must achieve a C grade or better:

English (Full Year)
English as an Additional Language [EAL] (Full Year)
English Literary Studies (Full Year)
Essential English (Full Year)

3. Numeracy Requirement: 10-20 SACE Credits

All students undertake <u>one</u> of the following options and must achieve a C grade or better in at least one semester. Students indenting to continue Mathematics in Year 12 must select Mathematics for a full year in Year 11:

Essential Mathematics (Semester or Full Year)
General Mathematics (Semester or Full Year)
Mathematical Methods (Full Year)

4. Choice Subjects

Students select 60–70 SACE Credits (depending on their numeracy choice) from the subjects list on the following page. Students may elect to undertake a <u>Vocational Education and Training</u> (VET) course in Year 11, in which case they will select 40-50 SACE credits.

Reserve Subjects

Students will also select 2 reserve subjects, which will be used if they cannot be placed in one of their options.

Personal and Social Identity [PSI]

Students currently at Unley High School will be allocated a new PSI group from year 10 in 2025.
