This selection guide will help students and parents identify the compulsory and elective subjects studied in Year 7 at Unley High School. 1. Compulsory subjects

All students undertake the following subjects for a full year:

Students in the French Bilingual Program undertake Histoire/Géographie for a full year in place of HASS.

2. Languages other than English

All students undertake one of the following languages for a full year:

Students enrolling from year 6 will indicate 2 languages in preference order. All attempts will be made to place students in their first preference language subject. French Bilingual is only available to students in the French Bilingual Program.

Personal and Social Identity [PSI]

Students currently at Unley High School continue with the same PSI group from year 7 in 2025. Students continue to undertake all their compulsory subjects (outlined in step 1 on the first page) with the same students in their PSI group.

Languages other than English

Students undertake their chosen language for a full year in Year 8. They may then elect to continue studying their language in Year 9 and beyond.

Music

Only students enrolled in Music as a subject can access instrumental lessons at Unley High School. For further details about the Music program and instrumental options, please read the [Instrumental Music](#) information and consider the recommended background outlined in the curriculum handbook.

Special Interest Programs

[Special Interest Rowing](#)[§]

Students in this program undertake Rowing for a full year, in place of their HPE option (indicated in step 3 on the first page). Students continue to undertake Rowing for a full year in Year 8, Year 9, and for at least 1 semester in Year 10.

[Summit Program](#)

Students in this program undertake English, HASS, Science and Mathematics within the Summit Program. Students continue these subjects for a full year in Year 8, Year 9 and Year 10 with the exception of HASS for a semester only in Year 9 and Year 10. Languages are compulsory throughout the student's enrolment in the Summit Program. This means students are required to study their chosen language up to the end of year 10.

[French Bilingual Program](#)[§]

Students in this program undertake HASS, Science, Mathematics and French language within the French Bilingual Program. Students continue these subjects for a full year in Year 8, Year 9 and Year 10.
