



Year 10 Subject Selection Guide 2027

This selection form is a guide for students and parents to discuss their subject selections in the lead up to formal course counselling in term 3. At that time subject choices will be entered online via 'Student Webpreferences' where students will receive a unique login, password, and instructions to enter their choices and print confirmation. Subjects marked with an asterisk* or dollar sign\$ also have additional information outlined.**

Students will select 14 semesters from the following subject groups (a full year subject counts as 2 semesters). Students will also select 2 reserve subjects, which will be used if they cannot be placed in one of their options.

1. Compulsory subjects

All students undertake the following subjects:

Students in the French Bilingual Program undertake [Histoire & Géographie](#) for a full year in place of History. They must also choose French Bilingual in step 4.

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The following outlines specific information to elaborate upon the subject options outlined on the first page. For even more information, please visit the [Unley High School website](#).

Personal and Social Identity [PSI]

Students currently at Unley High School continue with the same PSI group from year 9 in 2026. Students undertake all their compulsory subjects (outlined in step 1 on the first page) with different students to their PSI group (with the exception being those in the Summit program).

Special Interest Programs

Special Interest Rowing[§]

Only students in this program can undertake HPE [Rowing A] and do so as their minimum Health and Physical Education requirement (indicated in step 3 on the first page). Students in this program may elect to continue HPE [Rowing] for a full year by selecting HPE [Rowing B] in step 4.

Summit Program

Students undertake English, History, Science and Mathematics within the Summit Program. Students continue these subjects for a full year in Year 10 with the exception of History for a semester only in Year 10. Summit students are strongly encouraged to continue their language in Year 10.

French Bilingual Program[§]

Students enrolled in this program study Histoire & Geographie and Stage 1 French in Year 10 for a full year.

Other Subjects*

Mathematics

Students elect either Year 10 Mathematics or Year 10 Pre-methods Mathematics as their compulsory full year Mathematics subject in Year 10. Students will receive a recommendation from their Year 9 Mathematics teacher as to which option is considered most appropriate for them and are strongly encouraged to consider this when making their choice. Students in Year 9 Numeracy and Year 9 Summit Mathematics continue this pathway in Year 10.

Café & Barista Skills[§]

Students electing to undertake Café & Barista Skills need to complete a separate application. Students undertaking this course should be considering a pathway within the Hospitality industry and will complete competencies towards Cert II Hospitality. Students cannot undertake both Café & Barista Skills and Gateways2Trades. They may select one option but not the other.

Music

Students enrolled in Music as a subject are expected to participate in instrumental music lessons, either through the government-funded program or private tuition options. Spanish (Beginners)

Students may choose to undertake Spanish as a standalone language, or in addition to another language previously studied. This subject is undertaken at SACE Stage 1 level and requires students to have no prior knowledge or experience of the language (whether spoken or written). It is intended that students will study the language for 2 consecutive years (at Stage 1 and Stage 2)

STEM

Students electing to undertake STEM need to have completed Year 9 Science and Mathematics with a B-grade or higher, and intend to study Chemistry, Physics and/or Mathematical Methods in Year 11.
